Professors Vacate Homes to Accommodate Students

Four professors, occupying houses on the Pennsylvania State College campus have been forced to vacate them to make room for thirty girls who want to study scientific housekeeping. The young women entered the institution with the Freshman class, and are enrolled in the course in Home Economics. Fortyseven girls are in the class this year, an increase of thirty over last year.

More than 200 applicants for addission to the Freshman class were turned away because of lack of accommodations, the registration being confined to 646.
