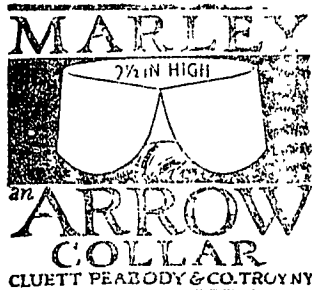

Engineering Extension take advantage of them. A Prof. J. A. Moyer gave a lecture three year course in textile engineering is being arranged for "Recent Developments in Steam Turbine Engineering" before a joint school. Looms and other meeting of the American Society of equipment are being secured for Mechanical Engineers and the Buffalo demonstration purposes in this Engineering Society on January course. There are at present about 7. 120 enrolled in this school.

The equipment of the department of mechanical engineering has recently been increased by the addition of a three horse-power Frost King gasoline engine made by the John Lauson Manufacturing company of New Holstein, Wis.; a four horse-power gasoline engine made by the Gray Motor company of Detroit; a six horse-power portable kerosene engine made by the International Harvester company of Chicago; a three horse-power crude oil engine made by the St. Marys Machine company of St. Marys, O.; and two detachable row boat engines made by the Evinrude Motor company of Milwaukee. One of these engines is made in sections for class room demonstration and the other has been furnished with the understanding that it may be used by students and instructors.

Prof. Hugo Diemer delivered a lecture illustrated by lantern slides on "Some Features of Scientific Management" before the Erie Extension class in that subject on January 8. This lecture was attended by several factory managers and other officials in addition to the regular members of the class.

This man had been formerly registered in classes at the Franklin Institute in Boston and in night schools in other cities.
