Amendments.

Sec. 1. The adoption of these articles shall require a majority vote of the student body. Sec. 2. After the adoption of these articles, a three-fourths vote

of those assembled in a massmeet-ing of the student body shall be required to amend them, providing at least two weeks' notice of such amendment is presented in

writing at a regular massmeeting. Sec. 3. Repeal. These articles may be abolished by action of the may be abolished by action of the faculty alone in their regularmeet-ing after one months' notice to students and faculty or by a three-fourths vote of the mass-meeting consisting of two-thirds of the regularly enrolled students of the college after at least one months' public notice of such meeting.
