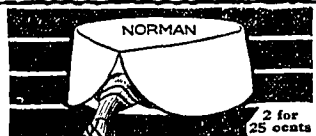

**Departmental Notes**

The Mining department recently purchased two mine surveying instruments of the Gurey make.

Dr. Moore of the Mining department will spend the next six months studying at the University of Paris.

Mr. Boyd Dudley, professor of Metallurgy, will read two papers before the American Institute of Mining Engineers Convention next week in New York

A new course in romance languages is being formed by Professor Foster. It is proposed to have a class in Italian and one in Portuguese taught by Mr. Baker, the new instructor of languages. Regular credit will be given for those taking these courses.

Due to the installation of a course in Commerce and Finance, the Liberal Arts school enrollment has increased by men changing courses. The changes include eight in the Engineering school, one from the School of Mines, five from the School of Natural Science, five from the School of Agriculture, and one from the School of Home Economics

Associate Professor J. S. Lalsalle of the Physics department, will conduct a class in the Physics department at the University of Chicago during the summer session.

In the five summer sessions there have been 2135 students of these 361 have attended all five sessions. A greater enrollment than ever is expected this year.

The Music department has been incorporated in the Liberal Arts School. Professor Robinson is head of the department.

**New Experimental Plant**

Officials of the Pennsylvania State College have been notified by the secretary of the United States Department of Agriculture that an experimental plant to determine the causes and effects of explosions of dust in grist mills in co-operation with the engineering experiment station and the department of mechanical engineering. It will be the first large experiment of this kind ever attempted. Construction of the plant is to begin immediately, and when complete it will be fully equipped with milling machinery.

Professor J. A. Moyer, will have charge of the experiment. B. W. Dedrick, instructor in flour milling, will operate the plant, and M. P. Helman, an instructor in mechanical engineering will serve as the technical expert

Aroused by the numerous grain dust explosions both in this country and abroad, the government was requested to conduct the investigation by the Millers' Committee, of Buffalo, N. Y., where an explosion of grain dust in 1913 killed 33 persons, injured 70 others, and caused a property loss of \$70,000,000.

Penn State was selected for the experiment in preference to the University of Kansas, University of Minnesota, and the Michigan Agricultural College, all of whom sought the experimental plant.
