When Dr. Weber went to Scranton, he was succeeded by Dr. E. R. Smith, associate professor of mathematics at this institution. Under Dr. Smith's adminstration as acting director, the summer session has been developed until it regarded as one of the principal phases of the State College's work.

Although the faculty is still drawn for the most part from the regular instructors of the college, nevertheless from time to time specialists in various lines of work have been called in to assist in the work.
