

**STUDENTS EARN BIG SUMS
THIS YEAR AT PENN STATE**

Students at the Pennsylvania State College have earned more than \$8,000 through outside activities during the last year according to the report of Thomas C. McConnell, secretary of the student employment bureau. He estimated that \$3,500 would be earned during the summer through sales of cooking outfits, books, maps and home machinery.

The report shows that the employment bureau assisted worthy students to earn \$3,500 in the village during the college year. They washed dishes, worked on farms, cleaned houses, did typewriting and clerical work, and attended gardens. Catering and waiting tables netted about a thousand dollars more.

The student workers earned \$2,800 more than last year, said the report, and this was accounted for by the rush for work of all sorts following an increase in living costs in the village. Board was increased from \$3.50 to \$4.00 a week, and in many cases a dish washing job kept the student in college.

Mr. McConnell recommends that a uniform rate of twenty cents an hour be established for all odd jobs, and that a maximum of three hours labor a day be required in cases where board is the compensation.

No final examinations are to be given out of the order prescribed nor before the dates indicated, excepting that when students desire to take the permanent state certificate examination which is to be held at State College, August 5th and 6th and have conflicts, they may be given their examinations prior to the regular examination dates, but not earlier than Wednesday, August 4th. Arrangements for such earlier examinations must be made with the instructors in charge.
