by Clark. It was State's ball on her 42 yard line when the final whistle blew. The lineup: LEHIGH-7 Subbage, L. E., W. McCarty, Parrish, J. G., H. McCarthy, Conover, R. G., Beck, Carrick, R. T., Richards, Higgins, R. E., Good, Ewing, Q. B., Chenoweth, Robb, L. H., Brunner, Beck, H. H., Herrington, Clark, F. B., Maginnes, Retterer, Thorpe, Columbia, Umpire Maxwell, Swarthmore, Head Linesman Ryan, Michigan, Field Judge Cooney, Princeton, Time of Quarters 15 minutes each...

The rest of the line-up remained intact. Both sides showed great determination. Lehigh to wipe out State's meagre lead, and State to make it even greater. The Blue and White eleven gained consistently through the line, but penalties or fumbles at important moments proved the stumbling block for touchdowns. Lehigh on the other hand, could do nothing with State's line behind this. In fact, they lost more ground than they gained during actual scrimmage. But they opened up a bewildering aerial attack which netted them gain after gain and finally resulted in a touchdown.

Clark received the kick-off on the 15 yard line and returned it 25 yards. After Beck had made 4 yards through the line, Clark fumbled a bad pass from center, but recovered it for a five yard loss. To Lehigh's 10 yard line, Brunner punted to Ewing, who returned it 12 yards. Four successive plays at left end yielded two first downs, and in three plays around the opposite end, Clark and Beck had gained 17 yards more, when State was penalized 15 yards for holding. State could not gain. An exchange of punts followed with Clark having the better of it. State was penalized 20 yards for holding. Clark again punted but Lehigh failed to gain also. Parrish blocked Brunner's punt, but Lehigh recovered. Another exchange of punts followed, giving Lehigh the ball on her own 20 yard line.

EWING GOES ACROSS. Brunner punted to Ewing at mid-field. Beck and Ewing gained ten yards. Ewing went around end on a beautiful open field run for 25 yards missing the ball on the 15 yard line. Clark gained two, when the quarter ended. On the first lineup when play was resumed, Ewing went around end for a touchdown. Conover kicked the goal which made the score 10-0.

Maginnes ran the kickoff back 60 yards and was caught behind by Ewing on State's 35-yard line. Brunner

shot a forward to Maginnes which put the ball on State's 10 yard line. But here the big Blue team, with their backs to the wall, threw back three of Lehigh's charges for no gain, and a forward pass over the line was broken by Carrick. Clark punted from the 20 yard line and Krushank downed the man in his tracks at mid-field. Ewing intercepted a forward pass on State's 27 yard line and Clark punted to Lehigh's 20 yard line. As usual, Lehigh lost an attempt to run around left end. They failed at a forward, and punted out of bounds. Clark returned the kick.

LEHIGH SCORES. Maginnes made his team's first real gain through the line—five yards, but an end run lost 2 yards. Brunner began to hurt forwards. Maginnes got the first for a gain of 13 yards. Frazm got the next and carried the ball to the eight yard line. Ewing was hurt and Jones took his place. The State line again held like a stone wall, but on the last down, Hurley caught a pass from Herrington behind the goal line for a touchdown. McCarthy kicked the goal. Score, State 10, Lehigh 7.

After receiving the kickoff, Brunner worked two more forwards on to the 25 yard line and another to Hurley for 10 yards. Carrick broke up the next one, and another was spoiled

THE MECHANICALS will show sectional models of machines and engines; tools, appliances, parts of machines, instruments used in testing, and many photographs and drawings of apparatus. THE CIVILS will have an exhibit a number of drawings, student work in design, and photographic showings the methods of road building.

THE INDUSTRIALS will show student work in machine tool practice, particularly in turning and woodwork. THE ELECTRICAL display will be located in Engineering "D" and will contain the various types of modern lamps and lighting fixtures. There will be numerous electrical novelties in the way of toys, and a full display of electrical domestic appliances. At certain definite times messages are always coming in and by arrangement with the operator in advance, those wishing to hear the signals coming in may do so. A couple of electrical phenomena or tricks will be on display, arranged by the students.

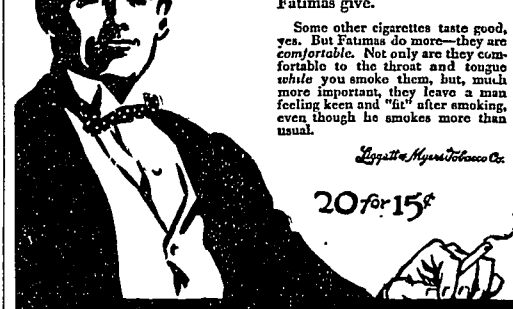
