Military Needs.

- (1) Allotment of necessary time to schedule subject.
(2) Suitable armory or building - the department of military training to provide:
(a) Drill hall - 200 x 400 feet clear floor sq. ft.
(b) Indoor galley 75 x 75 feet.
(c) Office for Professor and assistants.
(d) Rooms for each company's arms and equipment.
(e) Room for band and orchestra rehearsal.
(f) Training rooms for Engineer, Signal, and Hospital Corps and Machine Gun Companies.
(g) Four (4) Lecture Rooms (300 seats each).
(h) Room for storing uniforms.
(i) Two assembly rooms for senior and junior officers.
(j) Drill ground - 20 to 40 acres.
(k) In order to comply with all requirements of General Order 48, instruction should be given in gallery rifle practice. To conduct this practice will safely an earth bullet stop about five feet high and one hundred fifty long should be provided.
