

COLLEGE DESIRES BIG APPROPRIATION

Budget Drawn Up Calling for \$3,423,800; To Be Presented To Legislature NEARLY TWO MILLION NEEDED FOR ERECTION OF BUILDINGS

Preliminary steps toward securing from the State legislature the biennial appropriation for the Pennsylvania State College have just been completed with the preparation of a definite budget covering the needs of the College during the next two years.

Two years ago the bill presented to the legislature asked for an appropriation of \$2,347,000, so that the amount set forth in the present budget is necessary to make adequate provision for the needs of Penn State, exceeds that of the former budget by \$1,076,800.

In order that the needs of Penn State may be made known to the people of Pennsylvania, the figures printed below will be incorporated in a circular which is to be distributed throughout the State.

Details of the Budget. The following figures give the amount necessary for satisfying the needs of the College during the next two years.

To meet the necessary expense of maintenance of work at the College, including salaries, fuel, repairs, materials and the like, \$1,400,000.

To secure the appropriation offered by Congress for the extension work in Agriculture and Home Economics in the various counties, and to support the college industrial education in various cities, and also the Summer Session for teachers will require at least \$281,500.

To supply recitation buildings, shops, laboratories, barns farm lands and other equipment (according to the estimate of the deans as printed below) \$1,742,300.

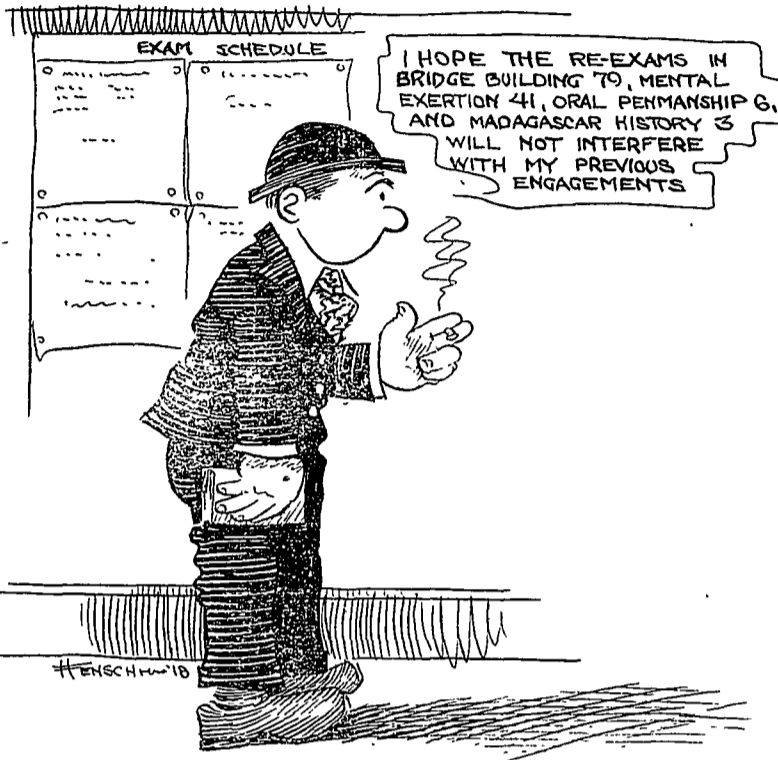
What Penn State Does. In order to draw to the attention of the citizens of Pennsylvania the benefits which they are receiving as a result of the work of the College the following question and answers have been prepared by the college authorities.

QUESTION: How is the Pennsylvania State College repaying the people of the state for the appropriation made to it by the Legislature? ANSWER: 1. By its agricultural, home economics and engineering extension work.

ANSWER: 2. By its vocational work in agriculture, engineering and mining. The value of products of the state increased in 1916 by more than \$14,000,000.

ANSWER: 3. By its correspondence instruction. More than 5000 students in various parts of the state are taking the lessons by correspondence in agriculture.
