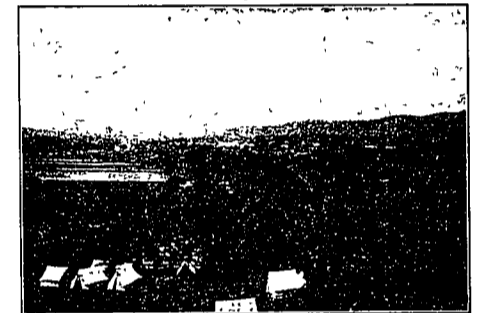
BIG DELEGATION TO GO TO CONFERENCE
