Miami, Florida, Nov. 25, 1917 To the Editor of the Collegian.

It has occurred to me that Penn State has a right to keep an eye on her "John Chinaman" when he is in this country as well as when he is in the Middle Kingdom.

At the present moment I am in beautiful Miami, tropical Florida, comfortable in my bath robe with windows open while you are up there in Pennsylvania...

It is only a hop and one finds himself in these wonderful glades of Florida which engineering skill is making ready for the farmer...

Let me tell you very briefly what I am doing down here. Within recent years citrus canker, a serious disease affecting most of our citrus fruits...

In 1915, Dr. Walter T. Swingle, of the Office of Crop Physiology and Breeding Investigations of the Department of Agriculture went to China, Japan and the Philippines and found the disease there.

China has much to offer the United States along these lines but we are going out there primarily to give and not to get.
