## Dickinson to Play Here on Saturday—Johnson to Do the Hurling for State

The Penn State "arsity nine will officially open the season next Saturday afternoon at 1 o'clock when they meet the Allegheny team at the New Beaver Field. Little is known of the strength of the Cullie aggregation, but it is believed that they have a strong team in the diamond sport as well as in the track. Practicing for some time, Penn State has a very strong team but because of the shortening of the college year it was at first decided to hold no intercollege games and, as a result, practice began at a late date. The team is made up of a number of their former "arsity stars to the service and by graduation. However, the Freshman team of last year has been called upon to fill the gaps and has done very well. They are led upon the field by the initial scullion, Coach, by ex-Captain Robinson, and he has been showing up very well in this berth. He played this berth on the Freshman team last year, but he seems to have gained much experience and is sure to show-up in form on Saturday.

**1920 Men Make Good**

The other members of the 1920 Fresh-

man team to engage in varsity ball on Saturday are Humbaugh, who will be on the receiving end, Menkale at short, and St. Mingle will play the outfield. The men have shown true varsity spirit in practice, and a Penn State student body will be able to witness them in their first college game on Saturday.

The captain of the varsity who will lead the official outfields is Dickinson on Saturday, are Johnson, the star twirler, who seems to be going at top speed this year and who will undoubtedly open the game for State. Mingle will cover second base, while he will hold down the third sack Grubb in left-field, and Cooledge in right will form Penn State's opening varsity team. All of these men have been showing up well and second base will be expected to give the Dickinson collegians a fight to the finish on Saturday.

## FEW MEN COMPETE IN HANDICAP MEET

At the all-college Handicap Track and Field Meet held last Saturday afternoon, Ganzmuller produced the greatest sensation by getting over the 100-yard course in ten seconds flat. Hocker, the second man, had a three-yard handicap, but "Ganz" made him look as though he was mauling time. Generally, the results showed a dramatic improvement over last

The time in the dashes was cut by a few seconds, although the longer runs showed up a trick. In the field events, however, substantial gains were shown over previous records.

First prize in the 220-yard dash went to Ulfery who covered the ground from scratch in 22.2 seconds, with plenty of "pep" left at the finish. Honors for first place in the quarter mile were divided between Kral and scratch, and Riley, whose

had a thirty-yard handicap, both crossing the line in 51 seconds. Demming, the Meadowbrook star easily took first place in the half-mile, running it from scratch in 2:21 while the lead in the one-mile went to Maxwell, with a handicap of 105 yards, in 4:39.1. In the two-mile event, McCallum finished ahead of Oberholser, the only other entry, in 11:47. Oberholser had 100 yards as a handicap, while McCallum ran scratch, but finished with a good

In the field events Emory stood out most prominently, securing three first places. With a 15-foot handspan, he cleared the wire 15 feet, and in the discus event the throw netted him 109 feet, with a handspan of ten feet. The hammer throw also went to him at scratch with a heave of 118 feet ten inches. Terrell took the shot-put event when he heaved the sphere for 52 feet 4 inches with an eight-foot handspan. Hill led the pole vault, clearing the bar by 10 feet, nine inches with an 8-inch handspan. Maiter, who heretofore had been doing good work in this branch, was eliminated at 9 feet, six inches but in the high jump, Maiter with a five-inch handspan, tied with Bentez who had eight inches for his place at four feet ten inches. Defferre took the broad jump, spreading himself
