NATIONAL MILITARY CAMP OPENS MONDAY

Several Hundred Men Expected
Here to Take Four Weeks of
Military Training

A national military training camp will open at the Pennsylvania State College next Monday, July 22, extending over a period of four weeks, and closing on August 16. The purpose is to train men of draft age before they are called into the service and to prepare those not within the draft age to be formed into a home guard against foreign invasion or internal difficulties, in the absence of our young men at the front.

While the enrollment will not be as large as expected, due to setting forward the draft one month which takes many men who would have come, yet it is very likely that the number to be here will total several hundred. The military instruction will be under the charge of Major Baylies, commandant at the college, who will have a number of men under him as assistants.

The scope of the military training will include the following: school of the soldier, including setting up drill, formations, manual of arms, bayonet exercises and ceremonies. Practical instruction will also be given in trench warfare, such as laying out and constructing of trenches, underground shelter, and connecting lines, use of hand grenades, gas masks, and the like. The trenches will be dug in the low ground to the east of the street which connects McAllister Hall and College avenue. There will also be intensive instruction in topography, mapping, bridge construction, and other forms of military engineering. Special features will be the laying out, setting up and striking of camps, as well as an indoor rifle range and field target practice.

The camp laid out by U. S. Army officers for the high school boys who were trained here in farming during May and June will be used for the new national camp. The Pennsylvania Young Men's Christian Association will maintain a headquarters in the camp and will have charge of the reading and writing rooms, camp stationery and recreation. About twenty seven acres of the campus will be available for the military instruction, including New Beaver Field, Holmes Field, and the Military Parade ground west of the Armory. The camp is being conducted by the college in cooperation with the U. S. Government and the Pennsylvania Council of National Defense and the Committee of Public Safety.

NEW HEAD OF COMMERCIAL DEPT. IN BELLEFONTE H. S.

Miss Grace S. Stevens, who has been in the employ of the college for the past four years as auditing clerk, has accepted the position of commercial teacher in the Bellefonte High School for the coming year. Miss Stevens has been teaching two evenings each week for the past three months, in the Bellefonte High School, the commercial classes for the Patriotic League of Bellefonte. Her work was so satisfactory that the Board of Directors of the Public Schools asked her to take charge of their commercial department for next year. Miss Stevens was graduated from the Millersville State Normal School, she out of a class of 144, receiving the gold prize for the best teaching in the Model School. She is also a graduate of the Pennsylvania Business College, and took advanced work at the Wharton School of Commerce and Finance at the University of Penn-

sylvania. She will leave State College at the end of the Summer School to take up advanced commercial studies in Philadelphia during the month of August.

During the coming winter Miss Stevens will make a study of the various industries of Bellefonte needing the services of stenographers and bookkeepers and will endeavor to train the students of the commercial department along these lines. Some of the more practical requirements of a business training which will be introduced will be the receiving and answering of daily mail, writing and answering telegrams, and giving intelligent information to telephone inquiries. Miss Stevens has had practical experience as a stenographer, a bookkeeper, and also as a teacher.
