Y. M. C. A. HUT IS OFFICIALLY DEDICATED

The formal dedication and "house warming" of the new Y. M. C. A. Hut was held on last Thursday evening and a large crowd of students enjoyed the program which had been prepared under the direction of Secretary Donor.
