A NEW YEAR

The latest Penn State man to be decorated is First Lieutenant Harold L Reese, of Mahanoy City, Pa. Lt Reese was a member of the class of 1919 before his enlistment, and while in college he was enrolled in the course in education and psychology.

The citation is as follows: "First Lieutenant Harold L Reese, This brave infantry soldier heroically held his position during the bombardment, July 15, 1918. During the unprecedented artillery bombardment preparatory to the great German offensive of July 15, Lieutenant Reese maintained liaison between different signal units by visiting positions during the bombardment.
