Lafayette Defeated

The Lafayette contest was a much more interesting game. Penn State scored all its runs in the third inning, when three bunched hits and errors by the Lafayette men permitted three Billo and White runners to cross the plate. Mullan saved the game from going into extra innings when he made a sensational one-handed catch of Buechner's long fly in the seventh inning. The ball rose high, and Mullan went into deep center for it, and even then was forced to make a sprint and a leap to spear the ball. A runner was on second base at the time and the scene would have been tied, had Mullan not made this thrilling catch and retired the side.

Penn State's scoring started with a walk for Wolfe and a double by Korb, which scored the first basemen. Knapp followed with a single, and Mullan singled to right almost immediately

man won by a very slight margin. The big surprise of the meet came when McFadden of Penn State scored an easy victory over Penn's star boxer, Don Lew, in the 135-pound class. The Penn man spent the most of his time in the ring in attempting to solve McFadden's style of attack and defense, but meanwhile the Penn State man struck him continually in effective places and won the decision easily.

In the 145-pound bout, Grant of Penn won a decision over Cooper of Penn State. Cooper had his bout won until the last thirty seconds, when he weakened and the Penn man landed him four or five tolling blows which gained him the decision.

The 160-pound bout between Alken of Penn State, and Armstrong, of Penn, was the only contest to go over three rounds. Alken finally winning the decision in the extra round. This bout was much different from the others, both men being very much exhausted at the end of the third round, and considerably bruised. However, Alken came back strong in the extra session and pummeled his opponent severely, forcing him to give way and putting a great deal of force behind each blow.

The heavy weight bout was a surprise to Penn State enthusiasts as far as its outcome was concerned. It was expected that Henney would easily win over his rival, but Bourne, the Penn man, reserved his strength, with the result that his fighting in the second

and third rounds was so much superior to the Penn State man's that he won the decision. The bout opened with a rush on the part of the Penn State representative. Henney struck his man time and again, twice forcing him over the ropes and into the crowd with telling blows. However, as the close of the first round drew near, Henney was not very observant of his guard and while making a terrific push, received a blow on the jaw which temporarily floored him. Better hoing in the other rounds won the decision for Bourne.

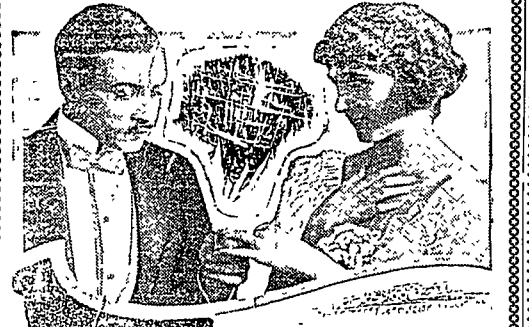
ump, disease throw. There may be cases however, where the event will be run a little ahead of the scheduled time, and it will be necessary for each team to

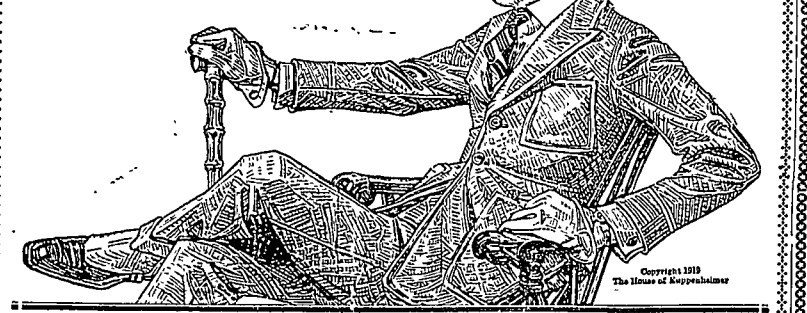
