

"DOC" LEWIS ACTIVE IN MILITARY WORK

"Doc" Lewis, the wrestling coach, has had an active military career. He volunteered during the early summer of 1917, was accepted and sent to the second Officers' Training Camp, at Fort Niagara, N. Y., on August 25, 1917. He was commissioned a first lieutenant of infantry, N. A., on November 27th of that year.

The Depot Brigade, and in addition was made Sanitary and Athletic Officer for the Battalion. In March of 1918, "Doc" was detailed to Division Headquarters and assigned to special duty as an instructor of physical education and hand-to-hand combat to the officers of the 80th Division, later the 37th Division, and still later to the officers and non-coms of the replacement troops.

DR. FORMAN NOW ACTING HEAD OF GREEK DEPT.

During the leave of absence of Doctor C. O. Harris, of the Department of Greek, who is recuperating from an attack of influenza contracted last spring, his post is being filled by Doctor L. L. Forman, formerly of Cornell University. Doctor Forman received his degree as Doctor of Philosophy at Johns Hopkins University and took up his work as instructor of Greek at Cornell in 1891, where he remained until 1900. Two years later he returned to Cornell but resigned his position there ten years ago because of the decrease in the number of Greek students. Since then he has devoted much of his time to travel.

Dr. Forman made his residence in England in 1915 and took an active interest in the cause of the Allies during the Great War. He returned to this country for a short period in 1915 in connection with a patriotic mission part of his time during the war was spent as an instructor in a great munition factory just outside of London. Doctor Forman said, "Here I saw men and women of all classes of society and again engaged with arms and ammunition. The living conditions were almost unbearable. Food was very scarce and of a quality which we Americans would deprecate absolutely unfit for consumption."

In 1918 he joined the British Ministry of Information under the directorship of Lord Rothermere, and rendered valuable service to Britain's cause. "I have come back to America," said Doctor Forman, "filled with great admiration for the English tenacity of purpose, and a feeling that England and America must and will be most closely united for the common welfare of both."

During the war, Doctor Forman traveled in seven European countries and declares that it is difficult to picture the material state of affairs in the Old World, especially in Italy and France, to those who have not actually witnessed those conditions for themselves, and that grave consequences may result from the peace as it is now formulated.

Doctor Forman expresses himself as delighted with Penn State in every respect and is confident that his temporary stay here will be a pleasant one.

TWO MEETS ARRANGED FOR CROSS-COUNTRY TEAM

Two cross-country meets have been arranged so far, with more in view. On November first, the Penn State cross-country team will journey to Philadelphia, with the football team and take part in a hill and dale run with Penn's cross-country men, during the Penn State-University of Pennsylvania football classic. The next event will take place here on Pennsylvania Day with Lehigh. This meet will be so arranged that it will finish in front of the grandstand on New Beaver Field between the halves of the Lehigh game. It is hoped to have a meet with Pitt on Thanksgiving Day at Pittsburgh, although it is not assured as yet.
