INDIANA NORMAL WILL OPEN FRESHMEN SCHEDULE

The Indiana athletes who will represent Penn State in football games in the coming week will be the Normal team. This Saturday has not yet been selected. There is a wealth of material from which to pick and Coach Hiram is having difficulty in selecting the team. He has approved the most promising men from two trial teams which started scrimmage practice last Thursday. The players on these two teams have been shifted continually and new men added as they show promise. It is probable that numerous substitutions will be made during the game on Saturday, so that the coach may see what the different men can do and to give all the good men a chance to prove their worth.

The Indiana Normal team is coming to State College full of confidence and will put up a stiff fight. They have a fairly heavy team and one that will give a good account of itself this Saturday. So far Indiana has played four games of which it has won three and tied one. The first opponent was the White A. C., which was defeated by a score of 21 to 6. Next they played Saint Francis College and defeated them 19 to 6. The next match resulted in a scoreless tie, being played with Carnegie Tech. Freshmen. The last game resulted in a victory for Indiana, when they defeated the West Virginia University Reserves in a hard-fought match that resulted in a score of 7 to 6.
