Assistant Coach "Dive" Matthews, of the class of '19, played at fullback for three years. In 1915, he was mentioned as one of Walter Camp's possibilities for an all-American position. "Dive" is not only a maverick at the game but he understands it thoroughly. He is now starting on Keady's Mission Tigers.

MILITARY DEPARTMENT SELECTS CADET OFFICERS

The military department has completed its organization with Lieutenant Colonel M. D. Welby as commandant and Major C. W. Savage as his assistant. The R. O. P. HERRINGTON, Lehigh Quarterback in the intercollegiate heavy weight champion wrestler, and Rote, a substitute, appeared on New Beaver Field several years ago with Gettysburg, and thrilled the spectators with his long gains around the ends. The former is suffering from a bad dislocation of his elbow, which the latter has an twisted ankle and leg. Coach Deakle seems to have hit upon the right combination at last, and if the team plays against Lehigh as it did against Penn, there will be very little doubt as to who is going to win. Penn State's probable line-up will be Higgins, left end; Hens, left tackle, Osborne, left guard; Conover, center, Rauch, right guard, Cullage, right tackle, Brown, right end, Robt. quarterback, Way, or Killmeyer, left halfback; Holmes, right halfback, Small or Hess, fullback.
