The 168-pound class promises to be one of the hardest fought of the meet. Mower, Penn State, has gone through the season undefeated and seems the logical winner. Bergdoll of Lehigh gave him a hard fight in the last meet while Ashby of Penn, who has been out almost the entire year, but who showed up well last year is also counted in the line-up for honors. Red, of Princeton, also gave him a hard fight and will undoubtedly win a place. Captain Gray of Yale will undoubtedly be the hardest contender. He won his bout at the Navy last week and is the New Englander's best choice. Brown is the undisputed winner in the light heavyweight class. Good of Lehigh gave him the hardest fight of the year but he is not feared by any

means. The heavyweight class will also witness some hard contests. Farley is just rounding into form after learning the rudiments of the game and will be a suitable opponent for either Booth of Lehigh or Carpenter of Princeton, both of whom won from him but against whom he showed signs of being a strong opponent. Galt of Yale, a football man, gave the Navy man a hard battle last Saturday losing only after two extra periods. For that reason he is feared by all contenders for the heavyweight belt.
