

THIRD TIE-UP SCRAP TO BE HELD THIS SATURDAY

shall be roped off, within which enclosure the scrap shall take place.

Section 1. The scrap shall consist of six five-minute periods.

Section 2. Each tie-up shall count one point at the end of the respective periods.

Section 3. A double "tie-up" (the tying of both hands and feet) shall count two points.

Section 4. The side scoring the greatest number of points in the total number of periods shall be declared winner.
