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### DAIRY MANUFACTURER AWARDS SCHOLARSHIP

Yearly Prize Given to Stimulate Interest of Young Women in Dairy Husbandry

Recalling the importance of the dairy industry in our national affairs and the desirability of encouraging young women to take part in this industry, Mr. M. P. Sharples, President of the Sharples Separator Company of West Chester, Pa., is awarding an agricultural scholarship of five hundred dollars yearly, to be known as the Sharples Prize Scholarship. Its purpose is to encourage young women to not only make a study of dairy products and their value as food, but also to equip them to engage in public service work after graduation that will

assist in educating the American public to the necessity of greater and more intelligent consumption of all dairy products. The provisions of the Sharples Prize Scholarship is determined by the Committee as follows:  
1—This scholarship shall be known as the Sharples Prize Scholarship.  
2—The amount shall be five hundred dollars yearly to be paid by the committee.  
3—It shall be a Senior scholarship awarded to a young woman at the completion of her Junior year. Applicants will be considered from those having completed five semesters.  
4—Any woman in the college enrolled in the Agriculture, Dairy or Home Economics Departments will be eligible. A committee appointed by the faculty of the School of Agriculture shall award the scholarship on the basis of scholarship, moral character, and special fitness for responsibility in the dairy field.  
5—Its purpose is to encourage women to enter the dairy industry, especially along educational lines. The winner of the scholarship should assume the committee that she will spend at least one year after graduation in public service along these lines.  
6—It is desirable that the winner select special dairy subjects during the Senior year. Public speaking should be included in her course. The schedule of her Senior subjects shall be submitted to the committee for approval.  
7—The scholarship may be revoked at any time, in case two thirds of the scholarship committee are present at any meeting, notice having previously been given at a previous regular meeting, if the holder has been guilty of negligence or failure to comply with regulations.  
8—A full report covering the award at the time such award is made shall be submitted to Mr. M. P. Sharples of the Sharples Separator Company. This report should cover in full detail the provisions for the scholarship as made by the committee.  
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
