

FRESHMAN NINE WINS ONE-SIDED CONTEST

Outclassed completely in the first five innings of the game, Lafayette High School of Buffalo was compelled by time to call the game with the Penn State Frosh at the middle of the sixth inning, owing to close train connections which they had to make on their return trip. At no time in the course of the game did the Buffalo team have any chance of even getting the Penn State team a good game.

Each team retched the men in short order in the first inning, but early in the second inning, the Blue and White team found McGraw for three runs, which led them to maintain for two innings when Kelly lost control for a short time and the Buffaloes tied up the score. Longhurst replaced Kelly for the Frosh and allowed no more runs. The big blow-up of the game came in the fifth inning when the Freshmen broke loose and brought in eight runs. Peist replaced McGraw in the box but the change seemed to have very little effect on the hitting of the team.

Although McGraw had more strikeouts to his credit than did the other pitchers, these were so well scattered that little if any difference on the final outcome was made. Lafayette failed to hit consistently and as a result the runs were not brought in. The Nittany Mountain Club hit regularly and easily, although there were only two long hits, two three base hits by Carr. Errors were rather few, the game being lost entirely because of superior play on the part of the Frosh. There is some mighty promising material among the Freshmen and next year some of them should make a very strong bid for places on the varsity squad.
