

NEW HONORS CONFERRED ON PENN STATE SCIENTIST

Dr. Henry P. Armsby, Director of the Institute of Animal Nutrition of The Pennsylvania State College, continues to have honors conferred upon him with constant regularity. The most recent one took place at the annual Commencement exercises at Yale University, when the Degree of Doctor of Science was given him. Last April, Dr. Armsby was elected a member of the National Academy of Sciences, one of the greatest national honors which can be conferred upon a scientist. Dr. Armsby has been at Penn State

for more than 30 years and is known both nationally and internationally as the inventor of the famous calorimeter for measuring the maintenance requirements of animals. The one designed by Dr. Armsby is located here at the college and is the only one of its kind in the United States. Dr. Armsby is undoubtedly one of the greatest scientists in the country and is a well known authority on animal nutrition and agricultural chemistry. In 1918, after the signing of the armistice, he was selected as one of the four men to make up the commission which went abroad to study European food problems.
