For the convenience of the summer session students who are leaving State College on Friday and Saturday of this week, the COLLEGIAN is printing the schedule of buses, together with the train connections made, and the time of arrival of those trains at Philadelphia and Pittsburgh. Intermediate stations can be figured accordingly.

**Via Tyrone**  
 Bus leaving at 8:30 a. m., connects with the 10:30 local, 10:58 express and 11:56 express, eastbound. The 10:58 express arrives in North Philadelphia at 3:59 p. m. The 11:56 express arrives at Broad street, Philadelphia, at 5:45 p. m. The 8:30 bus connects with the 10:44 express, westbound, which arrives at Pittsburgh at 2:45 p. m.

Bus leaving at 1:40 p. m. connects with the 3:45 express and 4:37 local, eastbound. The express arrives at Broad street at 9:35 p. m. Also connects with the 3:22 express, westbound, arriving in Pittsburgh at 6:55 p. m.

Bus leaving at 4:00 p. m. connects with the 6:07 p. m. local, and the 6:45 express eastbound, arriving in Broad street at 11:55 p. m. Also connects with 6:05 express, westbound, arriving in Pittsburgh at 10:43 p. m.

**Via Lewistown**  
 Bus leaving at 12:30 p. m. connects with eastbound express at Lewistown Junction at 1:18 p. m., arriving in Broad street, Philadelphia, at 5:45 p. m.

**Via Bellefonte**  
 Bus leaving at 12:30 p. m. connects with Pittsburgh-Easton flyer, going east, at 1:25. Arrives at Easton at 9:03 p. m. If expecting to go to Philadelphia, change at Lock Haven, and arrive at Broad street at 7:55 p. m.

Bus leaving at 2:00 p. m. connects with westbound Pittsburgh-Easton flyer at 3:10 p. m., arriving in Pittsburgh at 7:55 p. m.

Bus leaving at 3:40 p. m. connects with Tyrone local, and makes same trains at Tyrone as does the 4:00 Tyrone bus.

The bus fares to the various places are as follows: Tyrone, \$1.75; Lewistown, \$1.50; Bellefonte, \$7.00.

**PENN STATE FRESHMAN CLASS NOW FILLED**

The Freshman class at Pennsylvania State College is now filled. Seven hundred and fifty applicants have been admitted and it is not yet known how many will have to be turned away by lack of necessary teaching and classroom facilities. The task of admitting this number was of such proportions as to overshadow the records of all previous years. It is estimated that applications were received from nearly 2000 high and preparatory school graduates, resulting in the burning of much midnight oil on the part of college officials to properly and in all fairness make up the personnel of the incoming class.

In placing the limit of new students for the coming year at 750, the trustees had only one course to follow--relief for already overcrowded classrooms and laboratories. With even this number enrolled at Penn State next fall the remaining classes will bring the total student attendance to over 3300, greater than last year when 3165 made the record enrollment.

**STATE COLLEGE BOYS COMPLETE WOODWORKING COURSE**

About twenty boys of State College, ranging in age from 12 to 16 years, completed a course in woodworking today. The course was given by Professor Reides of the Industrial Engineering department, and began on July 26th. The boys put in an hour and a half each day, learning the elementary work in the college shops. Tried out as an experiment, the course proved to be very successful.

**TOTAL ENROLLMENT**

In addition to the 1340 students enrolled in the regular courses of the Summer Session, registration figures on the special courses conducted in conjunction with the session show that there have been 23 school directors, 24 county ministers, 58 county superintendents, 46 vocational directors and 30 in the home-making course, here during the past six weeks.
