### WORK ON ATHLETIC FIELD MAKING STEADY PROGRESS

Ever since the close of the regular college term in June, work has been under way on New Beaver Field in an effort to complete the enlargement plans before the opening of college in September. Under the direction of Hugo Bezdek, director of the department of physical education, and Nell M. Fleming, graduate manager of athletics, about fifteen athletes and students have been making rapid progress, and so great have been the chances, that when the students return in the fall, they will hardly recognize the athletic field.

The football field has been greatly enlarged, and the gridiron has been shifted so that more stands can be built about the field. Careful grading was done, and then the field was completely sodded. The result is that Penn State is one of the first of the eastern colleges to have a graded football field. It is expected that the new layout will prevent a repetition of conditions last fall, when, due to the almost continuous rains, the field was little more than a quagmire.

In order to accommodate the shifting of the football field, it becomes necessary to move the baseball diamond and grandstand. A large stretch of woods has been cut down and cleared, and the whole baseball field will be shifted about 100 feet. The moving of the grandstand will allow the construction of additional baseball bleachers, while an enormous stand is to go up between the football and baseball fields. Due to the rapid growth of the student body, and the increasing popularity of home games, the old stands have been entirely inadequate to take care of the crowds. With Dartmouth

and the University of Nebraska as home football attractions this fall, additional stands were absolutely essential. A crowd of ten thousand people is expected to attend the Pennsylvania Day game with Nebraska.
