

**HEALTH SERVICE ADDS
NEW ANNEX TO HOSPITAL**

One of the first things noticed by the returning students and new men is the roomy sun-parlor annex to the Health Service Infirmary. This annex is for the use of the convalescing patients to enable them to get out of the sick room, and it will be a decided improvement to the hospital.

Dr. J. F. Hiltner, the college physician, also announces the addition of a house-keeper and a clerk to the Health Service staff.

The work of the college Health Service is to prevent, as far as possible, the outbreak of any diseases among the student body, and to care for those who are unfortunate enough to become ill. Every student is entitled to a free examination at any time to correct physical or hygienical errors, as a portion of the gymnasium fee is set aside for this service.

The Dispensary is open about four hours daily and students in need of medical advice are urged to avail themselves of this service, especially for what seems only a slight illness or trivial injury, as the object for which the service was established (preventative medicine) can best be served at that time.

The Infirmary and the Dispensary are located in the orchard near the Liberal Arts Building.

**FORMER PENN STATE MEN
MADE INSTRUCTORS IN E. E.**

The faculty of the Department of Electrical Engineering will be materially strengthened this year by the return of two Penn State graduates who will instruct in electrical engineering courses. The first of these men is Mr. Clarence D. Gibbs who, since being graduated in the class of nineteen fourteen, has been with the General Electric Company, the Raystown Water Power Company, and has served for some time as a lieutenant in the engineering corps of the United States Navy.

The other is Mr. Albert Demmler, who, after winning the White Scholar-

ship at Penn State in 1919, finished the work for his master's degree at Boston Tech, specializing in electro-metallurgical work. Mr. Demmler then secured one of the ten Scandinavian-American Fellowships, and has been for the last year at the University of Stockholm in Sweden. He arrived in America on the sixth of September and will be in State College in time to take up his work next Wednesday.

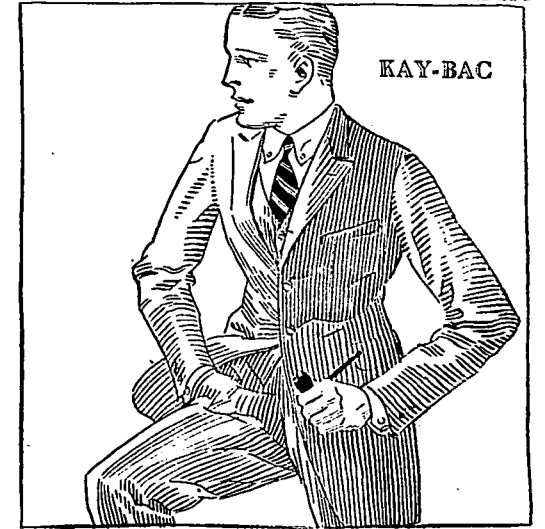
