

REVISED CONSTITUTIONS NEED STUDENTS' SANCTION

THREE CLASSES MUST RATIFY CHANGES MADE IN COUNCIL AND INTER-CLASS CONSTITUTIONS -VOTE TO BE TAKEN AT CLASS MEETINGS

Committees appointed by the Student Council to alter the Student Council and Inter-Class constitutions made numerous changes in these articles and the student body of the college must now pass upon the revised constitutions before they can go into effect.

Article 1—Name Section 1 The name of the organization shall be "The Student Council of the Pennsylvania State College."

Article 2—Object Article 3—Membership Section 1 The Student Council shall be composed of the President and Vice-President of the Senior class; the President of the Student Tribunal, the Editor of "The Collegian," the President of the Athletic Association, and fifteen (15) other Seniors.

Article 4—The Student Board Section 1 The Student Board shall provide for a Student Board which shall act as an advisory committee and which shall convey to the President of the College such actions as the Council shall deem necessary.

Article 5—Officers Section 1 The officers of the Student Council shall be: (a) President (b) Vice-President (c) Secretary

Article 6—Meetings Section 1 The regular meetings of the Council shall be on every other Tuesday and the special meetings at the call of the President.

Section 1 This constitution shall be adopted by the same procedure to be followed in making amendments. By-Laws

Section 1 Cushing's Rules of Order shall be used in governing the meetings of this Council except as they may conflict with the above constitution and these by-laws.

Section 2 The President of the Student Council shall preside at all meetings, shall appoint all committees, and shall preside at all meetings of the students which are called by the Student Council.

Section 3 The President of the Council shall have the right to vote on all matters that come before the Council. The Vice-President shall preside in the absence of the President.

Section 4 The Secretary shall draw up a budget and present it to the inter-class treasurer, who will divide the expenses among the four classes.

Section 5 The members of this Board shall be chosen by the Council members of their respective classes immediately after the election of the Student Council.

Section 6 The members of the Student Tribunal shall be chosen by the President of the Senior class, two (2) other Seniors elected by the Senior members of the Student Council, and one (1) other Junior elected by the Junior members of the Student Council, and the President of the Sophomore class.

Section 7 The President of the Senior class shall be President of the Student Board.

Section 8 The members of this Board shall be chosen by the Council members of their respective classes immediately after the election of the Student Council.

Section 9 The members of the Student Tribunal shall be chosen by the President of the Senior class, two (2) other Seniors elected by the Senior members of the Student Council, and one (1) other Junior elected by the Junior members of the Student Council, and the President of the Sophomore class.

The ballots shall be of a standard size and form and shall be numbered consecutively, and shall be distributed by the election committee one to each man as he enters the voting place. The preferential system of balloting for three choices shall be used.

The ballots shall be collected during the meeting and shall be counted in the presence of the class. The results of the first count shall not be revealed by the election committee until the recount is made. The ballots shall then be placed on file in the office of the Dean of Men, who shall also hold the supply of unused ballots.

The elections shall be held at the next to the last meeting of each College year. Following the election of the class officers, nominations for Student Council representatives shall be made.

The election of officers for the Sophomore, Junior and Senior years shall be under the supervision of a committee of seven, to be elected by the class at the meeting at which the nominations for class officers are held.
