

CONSTITUTION ADOPTED FOR TWO-YEAR "AGGIES"

(Continued from first page.)

President shall perform the duties of the President in case of his absence or disability.

Section 3—Secretary-Treasurer. The Secretary-Treasurer shall keep a list of the members of the class with the address of each. He shall conduct the general correspondence, attend to all notices and notify committees of their appointment. He shall keep a record of all the meetings of the class. He shall collect and receive all dues belonging to the class and shall deposit the same in a bank. He shall furnish to the President a list of all those delinquent in their class dues in accordance with the provisions of Article II, Section 3 of the By-Laws.

Section 4—Historian. The Historian shall annually compile a history of the class and present it to the La Vie Board upon request.

Section 5—Athletic Manager. The Athletic Manager, in conjunction with the athletic committee hereinafter provided for, shall have charge of all athletic matters pertaining to the class.

Article II—Membership and Dues.
Section 1. Any male person having matriculated in the Two Year Course in Agriculture in the Pennsylvania State College automatically becomes a member of the class. Any male person not having matriculated at the time stated above may become a member by a majority vote at any meeting of the class.

Section 2. The membership dues shall be at least one dollar and twenty-five cents a semester, twenty-five cents of which shall be for the maintenance of class athletics.

Section 3. Any person who has not paid his class dues within thirty days after the permanent organization of the class has been effected shall be denied all participation in class activities. His name shall be placed on a delinquent list to be furnished by the Secretary-Treasurer to the President, the above list to be read out at class meetings.

Article III—Meetings.
Section 1. Meetings shall be held at such times when the President of the class considers it necessary to hold them and shall be open to members in good standing and to non-members who have the sanction of the President to be present. The meetings shall be conducted in accordance with Robert's Rules of Order.

Section 2. A joint meeting of the two classes shall be called by the President of the second year class with the approval of the President of the first year class, whenever it may be deemed

necessary.
Section 2. Meetings of the class officers shall be held when the President of the class considers it necessary to hold them.

Section 4. Twenty-five per cent of the members of the class shall constitute a quorum for a properly convened class meeting.

Section 5. Notices of all class meetings shall be posted on the college bulletin boards at least eight hours before the meeting.

Article IV—Committees.
Section 1. There shall be committees appointed by the President of the class to take charge of special duties that may arise.

Section 2. The President shall appoint two members of the class at the beginning of the college year, to serve on an athletic committee, the athletic manager being the Chairman of this committee.

Section 3. This athletic committee shall have charge of the administrative details of all class athletics, such as calling out candidates for the various sports, arranging schedules and selecting members for the various teams.

Section 4. Meetings of the committee shall be held at the summons of the chairman of the respective committees.

Article V—Elections.
Section 1. The election of officers shall be under the supervision of a committee of three who shall be appointed by the President of the class

immediately preceding the vote.
Section 2. The nominations and elections for officers for the second year shall be made at the last class meeting in the first year.

Section 3. At the beginning of the college year, the President of the second year class shall call a meeting of the first year class, at which time the first year class shall nominate and elect a temporary President to serve until the election of permanent officers which shall take place not later than six weeks after the opening of the college year.

Section 4. No candidate for the office of Vice-President shall be nominated and the candidate for President who receives the second highest number of votes for that office shall thereby be elected Vice-President.

Section 5. All elections above are by majority vote.

Article VI—Amendments.
Section 1. These By-Laws may be amended by a two-thirds vote of the members present at any business meeting of the proposed amendment has been given at the previous meeting.

Article VII—Reading of the Constitution.
Section 1. This constitution shall be read by the President or some other designated person at the first regular meeting of the college year.

Article VIII—Time at Which This Constitution and These By-Laws Shall Take Effect

Section 1. This Constitution and these By-Laws shall take effect immediately upon adoption. A majority vote of those present at a regular meeting of the respective classes shall be required for adoption of this Constitution and these By-Laws.

Customs For Two Year Agricultural Students

1. Students not enrolled in a regular four year course who are registered in the Two Year Course in Agriculture are in duty bound to observe all of the General Customs and the following Class Customs.
2. They shall not have the privilege of going about bareheaded.
3. They shall not have the privilege of occupying the Senior Benches.
4. They shall not be privileged to go about without coats.
5. Members of the first year class shall attend all class meetings, athletic meetings, athletic contests and mass meetings and shall not leave same until closed by the proper authority unless a reasonable excuse can be offered.

When each uniform is worn, they must be worn complete and the coats must always be buttoned. No student in the Two Year Course in Agriculture may be considered eligible for any varsity athletics. Students in the Two Year Course in Agriculture shall not be eligible for membership in the interclass teams and squads of the four regular classes with the exception of such athletic competitions as may be held between the Freshman class and the Two Year Agricultural class.

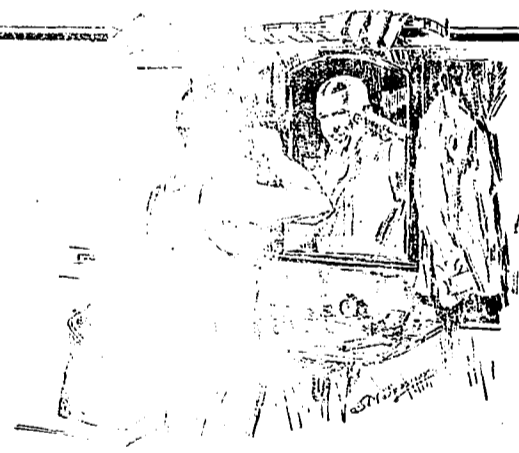
