

### COLLEGE R. O. T. C. IS ENCAMPED AT EDGEWOOD, MD.

Fifty-Three Members of Penn State's Military Organization Receive Practical Training

#### MAJOR WELTY IS ADJUTANT OF CAMP

Fifty-three members of the Penn State Reserve Officers' Training Corps are encamped at present at Edgewood Arsenal, Maryland. This camp opened the middle of June and will close on the 26th of this month.

At this summer R. O. T. C. camp, the men receive practical training, while at the college during the year they study the theoretical side.

Edgewood Arsenal is situated about twenty miles northeast of Baltimore, on the main line of the Pennsylvania Railroad. It is the home of the Chemical Warfare Department of the Army, and there is a large gas manufactory there, and a large factory for the making of gas masks.

The military instruction of the day is over at 3:30, and the men are free every Wednesday afternoon, and every week-end from Saturday noon until Sunday night.
