

ALUMNUS WRITES OF CHINA'S WAR

Sam Dean '12 Tells of Happenings in Connection with Civil War in the Orient Nation

The following is a copy of a letter recently received by Mr. B. W. Dedicke, of the Department of Milling Engineering at Penn State, from Sam Dean, a graduate of this college, class of 1912.

June 23, 1922

Mr. B. W. Dedicke, Professor Milling Engineering, Pennsylvania State College, State College, Pa.

Dear Professor Dedicke:— I just received a letter from our New York office that seems to indicate letter to you never arrived.

I had a very interesting time in the Civil war. Feng Yu Shiang, the Christian general, appointed me his advisor on technical matters so I went up to Shensi and marched 200 miles by foot and rode on freight trains many bumpy miles with his soldiers.

Now Feng Yu Shiang has command of all the armies of Honan and Anhwei provinces which makes him the ruler of about 50,000,000 people.

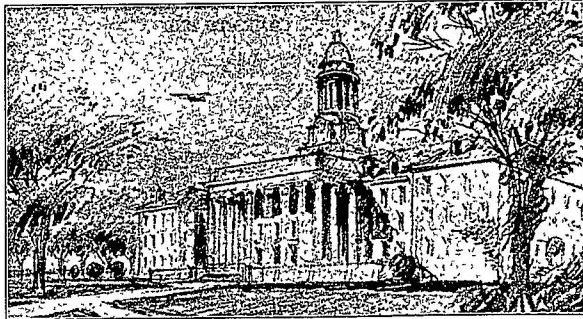
