### FRUIT JUDGERS COMING TO PENN STATE SOON

Team of Three Men Each Will Compete in Annual Apple Judging Contest

All members of the Inter-Collegiate Fruit Judging League have decided to send teams to Penn State for the Annual Apple Judging contest on December ninth, and live competition will be the result.

Three plates each of twenty varieties of apples, making a total of sixty plates, will be selected for judging. In ranking of the contestants one hundred points will be given to the correct placing and one hundred points for the correct identification of the three plates of each variety.

By means of cow testing and bull associations the Dairy Extension men of the Dairy Husbandry Department are striving to cheapen the cost of production of milk and produce better quality milk. They are cooperating with the milk plants, creameries, and ice cream companies to put out a better grade of products.

### AG. SCHOOL TO PREPARE "SHORT HORN" CATALOGUE

At a recent meeting of the enrollment committee of the School of Agriculture means were considered to bring the Short Courses of the school to the attention of the farmers of the state.

A catalogue of the courses will be published, and a special leaflet dealing with the creamery courses will be prepared. As a further means of getting men who would like to come to Penn State for the eight weeks course, all former "Short Horns" will be requested to aid in the enrolling of men in their vicinity who are interested.

Thirty-Third Year The thirty-third year of the agricultural short courses will begin January fourth, when it is hoped to have at least one hundred and fifty men on hand to take up the work. In spite of the already crowded condition of the college, every possible man who can be accommodated will be permitted to enroll in view of the service that can be so rendered to the men on the farms of the state who are desirous of studying some special line of farm work but who are not able to spend two or four years at college.

### PROSPECTS BRIGHT FOR NITTANY BOXING SQUAD

Candidates for 125-150 Pound Classes Numerous, but There Is Lack of Heavyweights

The prospects for the Blue and White boxing team appear to be good this year, although Penn State has suffered a serious loss of veterans through graduation and failure to return to school. There is however, excellent material in the sophomore and freshman classes; some dependable men in the second year classes are Williams, Wert and Zerby, all men who demonstrated their ability last year.

Most of the men reporting now range in weight from one hundred and twenty-five pounds to one hundred and fifty pounds while all of the heavy-weight class lack good men. Negotiations have been opened with the Navy team to box here, and also with the men on the University of Virginia, Massachusetts Institute of Technology, University of Pennsylvania, and Springfield. No permanent dates have been set for any of these meets.

### PAIN
