INCREASED R. O. T. C. UNIT IS GOVERNMENT REQUEST

Sixty-six Additional Juniors Are Needed in Advanced Course To Fill New Quota

Under the command of Commandant of Cadets, Captain P. L. Paulliger, U. S. A., who was appointed to fill the vacancy created by the recall of Major M. D. Welby into active service, the Penn State R. O. T. C. unit is preparing to conform to the request of the War Department for additional men from the junior class to enroll in the two-year course of advanced drill and military tactics.

The call from Washington requests that Penn State increase its quota to one hundred and sixty-six officers for the ensuing year. It has been estimated that one hundred students will have enrolled for the course during the registration period. Accordingly an additional sixty-six members must be obtained from the junior class in order to meet the expectations and desires of the officials at Washington.

Captains W. E. Bashore and B. A. Shipp, two new army officers from the infantry school at Fort Benning, Georgia, will be on hand to take charge of the field and class room work in place of Captain G. N. Randolph, who has been stationed at Panama and Captain R. R. Long, who has been recalled into service with the Thirty-fourth Infantry.

The Government pays an advanced course student a total of two hundred and sixteen dollars, in return for which the War Department demands five hours a week of the student's time and a six week's summer encampment such as was conducted at Camp Meade, Maryland, this summer. The student, upon the completion of his course, is commissioned as a reserve officer.

It is requested by the Military Department that all juniors who can schedule five hours per week in the work report to the commandant's office in the Armory as soon as possible.

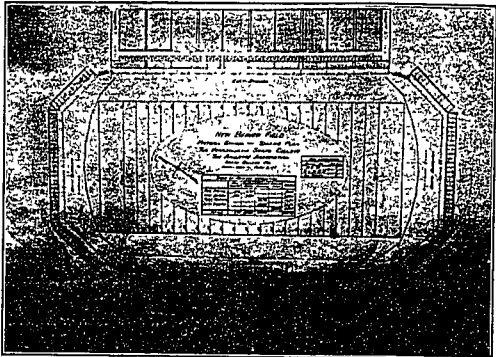

New Beaver Football Bleachers Will Be Ready For First Game



With two such headline attractions as the Navy and the Georgia Tech football games scheduled for this fall, the Penn State athletic authorities are anticipating the greatest crowds in the history of the college. Extensive preparations are being made for handling the record-breaking crowds and include the construction of a wooden stadium on New Beaver Field.

Work is being rushed on the new west stand, which will be similar in size and appearance to the east stand which was erected several years ago. The new structure will be completed before the first game, which is scheduled for September twenty-ninth and with the east stand will accommodate a total of 13,500 people. A large press box will be erected at the top of the new stand.

Temporary Seats

Before the Navy game, temporary sideline bleachers of five rows will be installed immediately in front of the east and west stands. In addition, the bleachers at the north and south ends of the field will be erected and will give the stadium a total seating capacity of approximately sixteen thousand. Seats will be reserved in these bleachers as in the east and west stands. In case of an overflow crowd, an area will be roped off at the north and south ends of the field in front of the bleachers. Low benches will be placed in this space and in this way an additional four thousand spectators can be handled.

Prices of Seats

The scale of prices of seats for the Navy and Georgia Tech games is as follows: box seats, \$3.50; east and west stands, \$2.50; north and south bleachers, \$2.00; overflow section, \$1.50. General admission for the first three games will be one dollar.

Of interest to those students who intend to follow the Nittany eleven on its trips, is the fact that grandstand seats will be sold for two dollars and a half on all foreign fields.

An interesting series of games has been arranged for the yearling eleven by Neil Fleming, graduate manager of athletics, which will make up the best football schedule that has ever been completed for a first year term.

The opening game of the season will be with Carnegie Tech on the home field on October thirteenth. Two more home contests will follow, Kild being played on October twentieth and Syracuse on November third. The Pennsylvania Day encounter will be with Pitt at Pittsburgh and will be followed by the game with the West Virginia yearlings at home on November seventeenth. The season will be completed on November twenty-fourth by the clash with the Penn freshmen at Philadelphia.
