

DAIRY HUSBANDRY CLUB PLANS ACTIVE PROGRAM

Sixty Members Attend First Meeting—To Finance Judging Team to Syracuse Fair

Discussions of both the National Dairy Show and of the prospects for Penn State's Dairy Husbandry Club were in vogue last Wednesday evening at Room 259 Dairy Building, where the pre-mentioned organization held its initial meeting of the year.

On the recommendation of several of the club members, it was decided that the club should send a judging team to the Syracuse show, and that it should furnish the sum of one hundred and twenty-five dollars, which is figured as two-thirds the approximate sum necessary to send the local delegation to the New York city.

In order to make the gift of this money possible, the club decided to sell cream, chocolate milk and other dairy products at various times throughout the year.

A special committee, the duty of which will be to furnish entertainment for the meetings, was also appointed by the president of the club.

Quite a number of students are planning to attend the Syracuse show and these men will leave State College either on October ninth or on October sixth.

The Syracuse show has grown to such immense proportions that it is now a national exposition, and not only the United States and Canada will be represented in the cattle show there, but there may also be quite a few foreign entries.

JUDGING TEAM CAPTURES EASTERN STATES TROPHY

Men Win One Hundred and Twenty-five Dollars—J. P. Willman Is High Individual Scorer

For the fourth consecutive time the Stock Judging team representing the Animal Husbandry department of Penn State won the Eastern States Trophy at the Eastern States Exposition held at Springfield, Massachusetts, September the seventeenth.

Each team was composed of five men from each of the various eastern agricultural schools. The team representing Penn State was composed of J. P. Willman '24, H. E. Warner '24, R. H. McCulloch '24, E. B. Kirsch '24, and H. D. Deibert '24.

Besides winning first place, the team won one hundred and twenty-five dollars in prize money. J. P. Willman was the highest individual scorer, leading his nearest competitor by 130 points.

The cattle exhibited by the department of Animal Husbandry at Springfield, Massachusetts, won the Grand Champion Steer award and the Grand Champion Steer Herd.

The total premium money received at Springfield was five hundred and forty dollars.

The Eastern States Exposition with the assistance of Professor F. L. Bentley were in charge of the cattle show and spent the entire week at Springfield.
