The proposed ordinance also regulates the height of building the building line and the area of lot that may be occupied by a building. It will provide for the appointment of a zoning officer from whom building permits will be secured. No permit will be issued for a lodging house or apartment house on any site that cannot be connected with a public sewer. A public hearing will be given on the report of the commission before it is submitted to Council.
