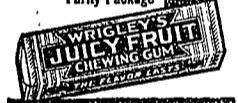

Lons, Jones or Hatzel may be used in this place, however.

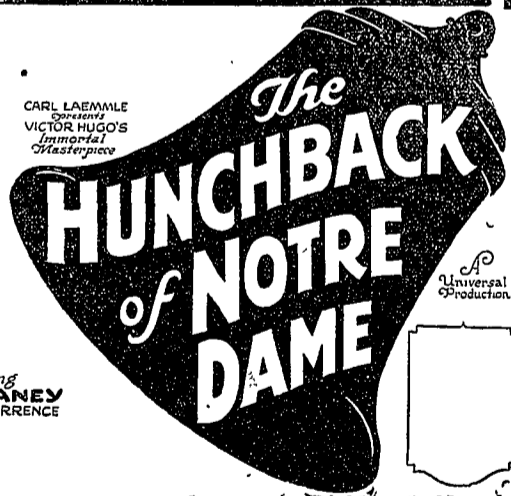
