## NITTANY STUDENTS WILL VOTE ON BOK PEACE PLAN AWARD

**Ballots Will Be Distributed in  
Classrooms—Thursday Is  
Last Voting Day**

**DR. TANGER HAS CHARGE  
OF VOTE AT PENN STATE**

**Referendum To Be Taken on Merit  
Basis—Author of Plan Will  
Be Named This Month**

A vote of the Penn State student or the plan-winner Bok peace plan will be taken here this week under the direction of Jacob Tanger professor of Political Science. An attempt will be made to reach all the members of each class and it is the duty of the committee to complete the referendum by Thursday.

Ballots were distributed in a number of classes yesterday and those in charge will have the vote well underway by tomorrow. Members of the freshman and sophomore classes are being reached through the classes in English. The majority of the junior and senior will be given a chance to vote in the classes of History, Political Science, and Economics.

For those students who are not reached in class, the COLLEGIAN boy will be placed at the entrance to the Nittany Printing Company and the COLLEGIAN office and it is the duty of the committee that every student in college vote. A number of cards containing the winning plan have been received, but there are not sufficient copies for distribution to every student. Anyone interested, however, may obtain a copy at the library or at the COLLEGIAN office.

## PENN STATE DEFEATED BY NEW YORK DEBATERS

Judges Give City College of New  
York Decision in Debate  
on World Court

Arguing the question resolved that the United States should enter the World Court of International Justice as it is now constituted, the affirmative team, representing the College of the City of New York, defeated the negative of Penn State at the debate held in the Auditorium on Saturday night.

The New York college was represented by Henry Spitz, J. Gurin and H. L. Weisman who won their debate on their superior delivery, an important factor in debating. They pointed out that a World Court could not claim for the settlement of international disputes with the highest standard of justice in the arbitrated world.

J. B. Rydell '26, C. S. Green '25 and D. D. Henry '26 upheld Penn State honor and presented several points why America should not enter into such an agreement. They have said that the Hague and other arbitration court have given just as satisfactory a result on questions brought before them as the World Court is expected to give. The greatest reason was that the United States would keep out of alliances with foreign nations. D. D. Henry was very forcible in the delivery and in under

## SENIOR WRESTLERS WIN CLASS MEET

**Coch Detar's Men Will Have In-  
tensive Training Before  
Syracuse Meet**

**FINAL CHOICE OF TEAM  
TO BE MADE SATURDAY**

From the work shown in the inter-class meet last Saturday Coch Detar has gained a fair estimate of the quality of the men competing for berths on the varsity wrestling team. Many of the faults that were not obvious during the last few days of practice were shown in Saturday's meet and it is the purpose of the coach to correct these faults and give the men a strict individual work-out before the men's individual with Syracuse.

The final selection of the team will not be made until Saturday, but candidates must weigh in this afternoon. Three pounds overweight will be allowed today, two pounds tomorrow and two pounds on Thursday afternoon.

The contest has now narrowed down to but two men in all weights except the 115 in which there are three contenders. Left Lehman and Cawley in the 115 pound class, both did good work on Saturday although Lehman seemed to have a slight edge over his opponent. Hunter and Sund are fighting for the 125 pound berth and here Hunter's experience gives him a little advantage. In the next weight, Capri Natio is leading Ruth for the 135 pound position. Taggart has dropped out on account of a bad leg.

The 145 pound division contains three contestants, Black, Lash and Ruth who are all showing good work. More speed is shown by the other men than by any other men on the squad.

### Presents Problem

By far the hardest selection to make is for the 165 pound division between Lehman and Ruth. These two men are evenly matched. They were paired against each other in the class meet and Ruth was given a decision for his aggressiveness; however, this is not a final test and a selection will not be made until until after the Syracuse meet. Decision and Ruth are entered in the battle for the 175 position and the heavy.

## UNLIMITED NUMBER WILL BE ADMITTED TO PROM

**Favors Have Been Picked by Com-  
mittee—Fraternity Booths  
Are Prohibited**

The privilege has been granted the Under-Prom committee of allowing an unlimited number of couples at the most uppermost social function according to a report received on Saturday from W. S. Fornari, chairman of the committee. The Prom this year will be held on Friday evening, April tenth.

An invitation in the pricing of the orchestra for the Under-Prom will be attempted this year. Hitherto, the orchestra has been placed on a platform built in the center of the Armory floor on this year's Under-Prom. Penn students who are to fund the evening's entertainment will hold forth on the platform at the end of the Armory. The promotion will be headed by an arrangement of sounding boards which will distribute the music equally to all parts of the room. This arrangement will take off the destruction of former years from the floor and will add nearly two hundred square feet of dancing space to the generally crowded Armory.

The triple train has been received and approved by the committee and the favor themselves are now in the process of manufacturing. To the best knowledge of the committee favors of the type selected for the coming year have never been given before at Penn State.

### Program Designs Submitted

Preliminary sketches on a special design for the program have been submitted to the committee. No definite decision regarding the program has yet been reached, but they will be planned especially for the evening festivities.

Since fraternity booths have been eliminated the decoration has been worked up in such a manner that space will be provided for fraternities and other organized groups. Several decorating companies and number of individual decorators are working on plans and the prom committee is working on a plan of its own.

According to the committee no fraternally furnished will be allowed in the Armory during the Prom because of the room it takes up. The various colors and sizes which would undoubtedly be given out in the night during the next two weeks.
