(Continued from first page) Interfrat Council appointed a committee consisting of C. W. Taylor '25, chairman, J. D. Davis '21 and A. E. Holman '21, to work with the Student Council and Intra-Mural committees in making an investigation. Another committee, consisting of R. C. Miller '25 and J. C. Kim '21, was appointed to investigate the advisability of joining the Intra-Fraternity and Intra-Mural Councils.

According to the general consensus of opinion, if the two councils were joined it would mean that concentrated action could be taken immediately with all matters dealing with fraternities at Penn State. At present, the Intra-Fraternity Council is not affecting its powers as it should and it is felt that if the councils are united, existing fraternity conditions would be bettered.

#### Delegate Reports Conference

After all the important business was disposed of, M. E. Mitchell '24, Penn State's representative at the National Interfraternity Conference which was held in New York City on December first and second made his official report to the Council.
