

PLAYING SEASON ENDS FOR UNIT BASKETERS

Semi-finals To Be Played Tuesday Evening—Units 21 and 15 Are Only Sure Entries

The official playing season for the Inter-Unit Basketball League came to a close when several exciting games were played on the Armory floor on Tuesday and Thursday evenings.

The big surprise of Tuesday evening was the 16-9 defeat of Unit 11, leader of Division One, by Unit 7.

Another Tuesday game, that between Units 7 and 16, furnished more of the interesting scraps of basketball.

Instead of the usual four-game schedule, there were six games run off last evening. This was done in order to bring about the end of the league at the earliest possible moment.

Although all division leaders cannot be announced at this time, those teams that will enter the semi-finals will be given notice and instructions in ample time before the date for their playing.

At the present time the only sure entries are Unit 21 and Unit 15, both of which are yet undefeated. Unit 11 is leader of Division One, but Unit 4 is a serious contender and much depends on the outcomes of last night's games.
