DR. BOUCKE SPEAKS ON TAXATION PLAN TONIGHT

Lecture on Proposed Mellon Plan Begins in Old Chapel at Seven O'clock... Professor O. F. Boucke, analyzing the Mellon Tax Plan, will deliver the seventh of the lectures of the Liberal Arts series tonight in Old Chapel at seven o'clock.

Dr. Boucke will discuss the proposed tax plan from all angles, presenting its effect upon both the laborer and the capitalist, and also upon the vital industries.

The significance of the plan, Dr. Boucke explained, "lies not so much in the reductions, which are trifling, as in the attitude taken toward business profits. It is frankly declared that these profits must be left where they are, instead of being confiscated by taxation."

The tentative results of the present law and the pending bill is as stated in various ways, but two points stand out clearly, namely: In the first place, seventy-five percent of the people will not be affected by the changes proposed, and in the second place capital is meant to be saved at the source rather than through the theft of consumers' Remittances of other features in the proposed plan, one must judge it mainly in the light of these two facts.

Coach Hugo Bezdek Approves Changes Adopted by Football Rules Committee

"I am strongly in favor of all of the changes that the committee has made," said Hugo Bezdek when questioned as to his attitude toward the changes recently made in the football rules. The most important modifications are the elimination of the mid-air take at the kick-off, which will now take place from the fifty yard line and the placing of the fifty yard line instead of the yard line from the goal posts for the trial point after touchdown.

"From the viewpoint of the outlook," said the Nittany coach, "there will be little difference made by the taking away of the ten in the old days, nor very long arguments, but we were gotten off with the ball lying flat on the ground.
