## LION TWELVE ENDS SEASON BY SCORING WIN OVER CORNELL

### Final Score of Game Is 4 to 3—Tally in Last Few Minutes Decides Contest

#### TEAMWORK AND PASSING ARE FEATURES OF TILT

Hackett and Shaner Score Penn State Goals—Frank and Yost Play Well

In their last game of the season, the Penn State football team defeated the Cornell twelve 4 to 3 on Saturday afternoon. The result was in doubt throughout the entire contest, and it was not until the final whistle blew that victory was assured for Coach Lattime's men.

The Blue and White warriors took the lead in the first few minutes of the initial period, when a long pass by Yost and an underhand shot by Shaner registered the first tally of the afternoon. Soon after this, however, the Red players advanced the ball toward the Nittany goal by a long throw, and in a short time it quick pass and a fast shot but the count at one all.

Near the end of the first half following much passing of the ball by both teams, Shaner got control of the sphere, advanced it by a long run and passed to Hackett who scored the team's second counter. The half ended with the score 2-1 in favor of the Penn State twelve.
