On the way to the dairy barn the college green houses are observed on the left and the stock judging pavilion on the right. At the model dairy barn is found a herd of about 150 purchased dairy cows and half a dozen pure bred bulls and a large number of calves. There are usually about 67 cows in milk and they produce over a ton of high grade milk every day. Certified milk is also produced here. In many of the stanchions are to be found high grade animals donated to the college by individuals and breeders.

The Experimental Farms—A hundred acre tract below the dairy barn and the poultry plant is devoted to experimental cropping of farm and garden crops. Here we find the oldest farm in the United States where different kinds of fertilizers have been applied each year for 15 years to the same plots to determine the effect of the various fertilizers on crop production. The garden crop experiments are along the roadway. Valuable plant breeding and selection experiments have been conducted here.

Thirty-four acres along the road to the box farms are devoted to orchard experimental work. The college has its own farm superintendent for the operation of its approximately 1800 acres of farm land.

Respiration Calorimeter—Attached to the rear of the main agricultural building is a small structure housing the only animal respiration calorimeter now in operation in the world. It is a complicated apparatus consisting mainly of a tank, a closed air-tight box or compartment in which live cows or steers are placed for experiments determining the exact use their systems make of all food and water consumed. The net energy produced in the animal by the food it eats is calculated through heat and waste materials given off. The use of this apparatus has done much in the 20 years it has been in use.
