### Engraving Contract

The engraving contract has been given to the Philadelphia Photograph Engraving Company, one of the largest concerns of its kind in the United States. This company has done excellent work on many college publications, including the Navy and Penn annuals. The White Studios of New York, who will do the photographing, are of international reputation, and did good work on last year's La Vie.

### Semester Dances

In addition to those given during organized home party weeks, there may be three afternoon or evening dances held each semester by the various social organizations of the college. These dances may be held on Friday nights and nights before holidays, and all dances, except during home parties, shall not continue later than twelve o'clock midnight without special permission from the Committee on Student Welfare of the College Senate. All dances and home parties must be provided with at least two chaperones, and the dates of the dances and the names of the chaperones must be filed with the Dean of Women at least one week before the affairs occur. The presidents of the respective organizations giving dances and home parties shall be held responsible for

the taking of proper steps to secure the observance of these rules by both active and alumni members and by guests.

The above recommendations, having been adopted by both faculty and student representatives, it is the desire of those at the head of the Penn State social program that they be observed closely during the coming year. The Committee on Student Welfare will hold the organization giving a dance responsible for the good moral conduct of all persons attending the dance, and will penalize neglectful organizations by suspending their social privileges.

### Senior Week

If it shall be so desired by the governing bodies of the various social organizations, the Committee has proposed that a Senior Week will be observed in the spring. This may be a three-day home-party program. If the Commencement home parties are held, they shall begin on Friday and end on Sunday, under the same regulations to the November or any other home party.

### Art Staff Appointed

The art staff this year will be headed by C. D. Seaman '26 and W. Ward '26. The staff has already completed designs for borders, insert pages and book covers. As the theme of the book is to be composed along the historical line, the sketches will be of four types, Greek, Roman, Medieval and Modern. Each one will be represented by a portion of the book.
