It is being effected, we are told, through improvements in farming methods, seed selection, and the introduction of new food crops from other parts of the world. "Striving to also bring ourselves through the College into South China, where milk has heretofore been practically unknown as a staple food."

"Daddy" Active Since 1911 The relation of Penn State to the work of Canton Christian College goes back to the time when "Daddy" Groff first gave himself to this work in 1911, when the "Penn State College Horticultural Mission to China" was organized here by him. A directing committee of students and faculty was appointed which has continued to act year after year up to the present time. This committee consists of three members, elected by the Student Council each year from the incoming Senior, Junior and Sophomore classes, also as ex-officio members the presidents of the Y. M. C. A. and the Y. W. C. A., and the General Secretary of the "Y." In addition two members are appointed by the Dean of the School of Agriculture.

In "Ling Naam," the news bulletin of Canton Christian College for August, 1924, a prominent place is given under the headline "Pennsylvania State College Mission to China" to the work of "Daddy" Groff. This record is the longest of its kind, and it is believed that Penn State has done more than any other college there at work, although none would say that enough has been done.

Photographs show that five women and eleven men were graduated last June. Staff items and photographs of the faculty show that in addition to the graduates from its own courses Canton Christian College at present gives places on its faculty to graduates from Penn State, Univ. of Pitt., Cornell, Yale, University of Pennsylvania, Dea. Mavr., Radcliffe, Mount Holyoke, and many others, including nearly all the state universities, east and west.

(Continued from First Page) According to the new booklet just published, it will be necessary in order for a student to graduate, that he not only obtain the credits fixed by his school, but an equal number of honor points. This is to be effective for the Class of 1928 and all subsequent classes.

The grade of honor points given credit in the subject, but gives no honor points for graduation. The student to effect his grades of merit, must have enough grades of two or three to make his honor points average one or better.

Any student who has not a sufficient proportion of honor points for graduation may obtain the same by repeating subjects in which honor points may not have been earned, or by taking additional subjects not required in his course but approved by his school. The maximum grade that may be earned by a re-examination is plus one.

Chapel Failures The old rules in regard to chapel attendance will continue in force throughout the coming year with the provision that any student who has failed in one semester of chapel will be dismissed from college when he incurs a second chapel failure in any subsequent semester.
