st and a great rally in the closing minutes of the game which netted them three points. Two long forward passes carried the ball from Penn State's thirty-five yard line to Lebanon Valley's fifteen yard line where the Newton second-string line held. The Biggie the state's plucky quarterback went back and sent a perfect dropkick over the bars for the first points that Lebanon Valley has scored against the Lion in years.
 One of the outstanding features of the game was Gene's twenty-seven yard run through a broken field for Penn State's only touchdown of the fourth quarter. The big halfback crashed through the line, sidestepped in beautiful fashion and shook off tacker after tacker, finally falling over the line, which line just as a Lebanon Valley man attempted to bring him to earth.

New Men Show Well

Although the new men on the team displayed their inexperience at several stages of the game their showing under fire for the first time was all that could be expected. "Bill" Baker at quarterback used excellent judgment and his choice of plays was good. Both Gier and Gene Baker even though bothered with injured feet showed up to good advantage while Light's simple system in the backfield appears to have hit its proper stride this year. McPhee a new man on the line did good work and added two points to the Nitany total with successful dropkicks after touchdowns.

The entire line proved to be a strong wall on the defense as the visitor against the Blue and White first team were able to gain but one yard in scrimmage. Captain "Big" Gray displayed his old time form at center, leading up Lebanon Valley plays before they were started. He also received a fumble, turning his string of consecutive games to ten in which he has either recovered a fumble or intercepted a forward pass. Last week the Nitany captain recovered a fumble or intercepted a pass in every game on the schedule. "Pat" Axtell at end was a third man to stop while Michalske on whom much of the success of the Penn State team this season depends, and Houe guards together with Prevost and McCann, tackles, fought every inch of the way.

work, the student should consult with the Head of Department concerned for the modification of his prescribed academic course required by the substitution of ROTC courses. The subjects for which substitution is made and the total credits for which substitution is allowed are determined by the Head of Department concerned.
 Due to the fact that the equipment and personnel of the Military Department is based upon the size of the basic unit, embracing the compulsory military training provided by the college, the size of the advance unit is practically unlimited and a greater number of Junior students could be enrolled. It

is believed that the Infantry and Engineer advanced courses would prove valuable to a far-greater number of eligible students. Further information may be obtained from the Military Department.


