SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS

It is often with no conscientious attempt to select the most deserving men and women that the undergraduate votes for his choice of candidates to receive the annual scholarship awards that are made at Penn State. This, in itself, is indeed unfortunate. It would be more regrettable, however, if the faculty committee, having final decision in the matter of making the selections, failed to donate the prizes to those undergraduates who were most deserving.

Recent elections in the Senier Class resulted in twenty-five candidates being selected for consideration in scholarship awards. These names now go before the faculty scholarship committee for final judgment.

Last year, notes of bitter disappointment were heard from some who thought that they had been overlooked when the awards were made. And it is only natural that a conscientious student would desire to be included among those who were considered eligible for such honors.

The point of the matter lies in the interpretation of what constitutes the best basis on which to bestow these considerations of merit. It is believed that the student who, while maintaining a high standard of schelarship, contributes the most good to the uplifting of the institution, and at the same time presents a needy case for financial support, should receive the first consideration.

The most important time for such a consideration of the merits of the respective candidates is before the undergraduates vote on the men and women. There should be a committee composed of both faculty and undergraduates to investigate the conditions surrounding each candidate for a scholarship award. Upon a report of the findings of this committee the students could vote intelligently and to the best advantage to all concerned.

There is no doubt but that the faculty committee will carefully and diligently pursue the respective qualifications of the candidates and base its selections accordingly. Such being the procedure there can be no further quibble as to the awarding of these particular scholarships. Here, however, is food for student thought and an opportunity to put into practice that famous line which reads: "None but back do? the best deserve the fair."

THAT PENN STATE "HELLO"

Right now while the freshman is being beset on every side with threats from the upperclassmen and is probably receiving words of counsel from his future fraternity brothers, an opportunity presents itself to add a word of friendly advice that may help mold the yearling into a better Penn State man.

There has been a custom established on this campus which is not uncommon to other institutions requiring that every freshman regard all undergraduates as acquaintances or even as friends. This customage and Blue bench. tom, insignificant as it may seem, is intended to furnish the individual a chance to become more intimately associated with the other fellow. Reference is made to the Penn State "Helle,"

It is a custom for all Penn State men, regardless of class or station, to say "Hello" to each other when passing on the street or in the halls or on the campus. But it is more than a custom as applied to freshmen; it is a rule-a law not to be broken without punishment.

Perhaps it is not the freshman's fault that he has not acquired the characteristic manner in which the "Fiello" is intended, for upperclassmen are equally as lax in extending this word of greeting and fellowship to each other as are the freshmen.

The "Hello" is not a salutation carrying with it an acknowledgement of submission to upperclassmen. Neither is it a passing word to be spoken in an off-hand manner as though the annunciator cared not whether he received a reply. The Penn State "Hello" is intended to create a spirit of cooperation and friendship between all classes and races on the Nittany campus. And when properly spoken it conveys the same cordiality as does the handshake which is seen so frequently when College opens in the fail.

It is a sign of recognition, a common word which is embodied in the Pena State spirit, and as such should be highly regarded. "The cheery 'Hello' marks the true Pena Stater," would be a good slogan for a practice week to re-establish the familiar greeting on the campus. Penn State is a democratic institution. Get the habit of saying
