"Barber of Seville," Directed by Kingsberry Foster, Draws Large Audience

ÆSTHETIC DANCING IS INTERESTING FEATURE

"The Barber of Seville," given by the Manhattan Opera Company, was presented last Saturday evening in the Auditorium as the opening feature of the current entertainment course of the Y. M. C. A.

This well-known opera comique of Rossini's, developed remarkably by Kingsberry Foster, the director of the company, bids fair to become the masterpiece of this year's course. It is said that Mr. Foster develops singers, who later achieve nation-wide fame, and judging by the performance of last Saturday night this promise is not unduly heaped upon the director.

Seven Piece Orchestra The accompanying orchestra of seven pieces, under the direction of Benjamin Sachs, rendered the music in numbers in fine style, and the selections for the dancing during the intermission were interpreted in fine fashion by Sachs, undoubtedly a great young musician, controls every movement, and it is due to the exactness of his baton flourish that the orchestra plays every number in almost perfect rhythm and harmony.
