M. Gill, on the line, and Hargest, in the backfield, on the second eleven are putting in strong bids for varsity berths. Russell and H. Gill who were out of the line-up due to injuries are back to their positions while McVaugh who was pressing the backfield men is on the sick list. Should any of the first eleven fall down in the opening clash, Coach Leonard will have reliable substitutes to call upon.

Syracuse Strong
 The Orange team will invade the Nittany Valley with fifteen men which will make one of the strongest combinations in the East. Last Saturday the FBI booters defeated the Cornell aggregation for the first time by the narrow margin of a 1 to 0 score.

Coach Lee's varsity eleven was given a blow when Condit, captain-elect, failed to return to school after playing a heady game of soccer last year. The work of Pike and Mahon, right fullback and center, respectively, in the defense work, was one of the main factors in the win over the strong Red team.

The Syracuse victory came after two extra five minute periods were added. Cornell fouled and Horley, center halfback, was given a penalty kick and beat the ball past the Ithaca goal for

the lone tally of the conflict. Coach Lee has drilled his aggregation of soccerites in a week of stiff practice for tomorrow's encounter.

Practice Methods

DR. S. W. FLETCHER PREPARES NEW CORRESPONDENCE COURSE

Dr. S. W. Fletcher, Professor of Horticulture, has prepared a new correspondence course on fruit growing which is much more complete than any heretofore given. There are now three courses, Orchard Fruits, Small Fruits, and Commercial Fruit Growing. The last named course takes up location, selection of varieties, soil treatment, pruning, spraying, packing, and marketing. It is intended to help men engaged in fruit growing as a livelihood.

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
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
