 certain that the Allentown lad will be
 found at the other end position tomor-
 row. House has sufficiently recovered
 from his attack of bolts to get back into
 scrimmage and he and "Mike" Mel-
 niske have been waging a bitter rival-
 ry for one of the guard posts and the odds
 favor the former to start against Tech.
 A short lay-off will do Melniske a
 world of good and with "Tank" McCann
 at quarterback and "Doc" Feis at center
 will be able to fill in the Cleveland lad's
 place in nice shape.

The Backfield
 Besides Watson in the backfield
 Coach Beede plans to start Lafayette
 at quarterback with Helbig and Ber-
 man in the two remaining places. "Bill"
 Baker has been displaying no end of
 "stuff" in this week's scrimmages and
 it is expected to come through tomor-
 row. The Johnstown boy will be
 pushed into the club. At center, "Doc"
 Feis will have his reliable stand-by "Bos"
 Gray who will do the punting and also
 the place kicking if "Doc" fails to
 kick into the line-up. Back will play
 the other tackle position.

Carnegie Tech invades Penn State to-
 morrow with one of the greatest flight-
 ing aggressions in the country today.
 A decisive victory over the Pitt Pan-
 thers, the Iowa titillation rival, is the
 outstanding achievement of the Tartans
 to date and Steffen's proteges argue
 that it is about time for them to attack
 the Penn State Jinx.

Tricky Plays
 While not attending his duties as
 judge in Chicago, "Wildy" Steffen the
 Tech head coach has given the Plaid
 warriors some of the trickiest plays of
 any team of the West and it was one
 of his unusual formations that enabled
 Beede Plaid fullback to break away
 for the long run against Pitt that paved
 the way for the winning touchdown.

Although Tech is represented this-
 year by one of the lightest teams in
 the history of the institution, fighting
 spirit on the part of every regular and
 substitute more than makes up for this
 lack in weight. A 14-1 victory over
 Davton opened the Plaid season while
 the following week, Thiel fell before the
 onslaught of Steffen's eleven 220. Tol-
 edo was handed a 51-0 whipping while
 the Plaid suffered its first setback the
 next Saturday and just managing to
 turn in a 10-0 victory.

Then came Tech's unexpected victory
 over the Pitt Panther and it was this
 triumph that stumped the Schenley el-
 even as one of the greatest fighting
 combinations in the country. Last Sat-
 urday Western Maryland the team that
 held Bucknell to a 6-0 score, invaded
 Pittsburgh and was sent back with a
 27-0 defeat.

Good Backfield
 in Captain "Obey" Newman, Beede

Weitenberger and Dastin, Tech boasts
 of an exceptionally fast backfield and
 one that will cause any team in the
 West no end of worry. Although Beede
 advanced the ball to a scoring position
 against Pitt, it was Captain Newman
 who crossed the line for a touchdown
 that sent five thousand Tech students
 into hysterics. And tomorrow after-
 noon, twelve hundred students, who
 will arrive in a special train are ex-
 pecting their team to turn the trick
 once more.

At the end positions, Steffen will use
 Goodwin and Hable, both men having
 previous varsity experience. B. Kris-
 toff and Yoder fill in at the tackle pos-
 itions with Anderson and Cass at guards
 and Manby at center. Manby is the
 outstanding lineman on the Tech team
 and his work against Pitt and Western
 Maryland drew no end of favorable
 comment from Pittsburgh's leading
 sport writers.

Killie Band Coming
 Together with the twelve hundred
 students, Tech's far-famed Killie band
 will arrive on the special train and this
 musical organization has done much
 for the team in the way of encour-
 agement so far this season. A special
 section has been reserved for the Plaid
 followers and it is expected that one
 of the largest crowds to ever attend a
 Pennsylvania Day battle here will vi-
 sion tomorrow's clash.

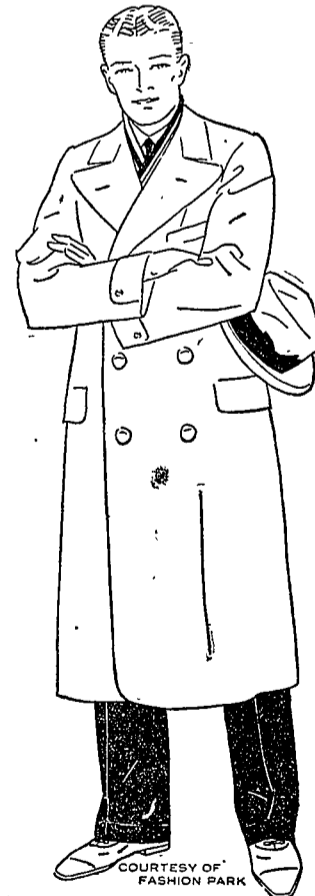
