Pitt Line-up

A battle is expected when Captain Gray and Johnson oppose each other since the Pitt snapper-back is ranked as one of the best centers in the East. Johnson is one of Pitt's leading tacklers who has worked on the weight events last year enabling the Panthers to make a creditable showing in the dual meet with Penn State at commencement time.

Medford Season

Pitt's record this year is anything but impressive. The Panthers having been defeated by Lafayette, Cornell, Tech and Washington and Jefferson. However, Coach Sutherland had nothing but good material to work with at the beginning of the year and his team in turning in a victory over West Virginia and holding service to the state has been something of an accomplishment in taking all things into consideration.

Starting the season with a 14-0 victory over Grove City, Pitt played Lafayette the following week and was downed after a bitter struggle. Then came the Panthers' unexpected win over West Virginia followed by the 14-0 setback at the hands of Cornell Tech. The following week, Johns Hopkins was downed 26-0 and a 7-7 tie with Syracuse came the next Saturday.

Geneva was defeated 14-0 and two weeks ago, Washington and Jefferson came up from Washington, Pa., and sent back with a 10-0 victory. The Panthers put up a great game against the Presidents, Ray Rad's secretary of a tumble and subsequent run for a touchdown along with Lafayette's field goal giving W and J its margin of victory. Pitt was a star on the Penn State freshman team in 1922.

Panthers Work Hard
Pitt has played for some time towards the Penn State game as the Panthers believe that a victory will give the better margin of just defeat, is this season. Although the Panthers downed three times the Panther is still the same formidable threat to the Mount Nittany boys that it has been in the past.

One of the largest crowds to witness a game on Forbes Field this year is expected when the two teams line-up on Thursday. According to K. P. Art and "Dad" were the outstanding performers. These two men were a continual threat with their forward passing combination with the ability of "Art" in running back punts was instrumental in taking the ball into Penn State territory several times.

Mehalske Scores

Penn State's second score came late in the first quarter when Mehalske ran eighteen yards for a touchdown after Lafayette's thirty-yard run-back of a punt and Benjamin's pass to Weston had carried the ball within scoring distance. On from other occasions the Blue and White this time failed to score but the station Marlett line held whenever its goal posts were threatened.

The visitors' only opportunity to score came in the third quarter when an exchange of punts gave them the ball on Penn State's forty-yard mark. A Witt's pass to Wolf was good for fifteen yards while another forward carried the ball to the thirty-five yard line. 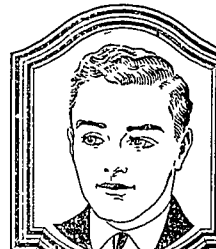

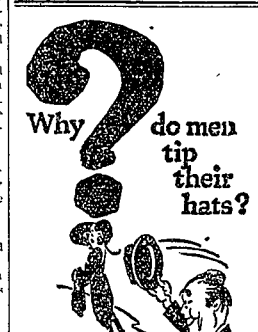
